
Abstract




Introduction & Background





Study Methodology

Sex education programs often heavily emphasize abstinence, leading to a lack of coverage on crucial topics such as contraception, consent, and LGBTQ+ awareness. Outdated or incorrect information can lead to misconceptions and risky behaviors, while cultural and religious influences can limit what is covered. The internet further complicates matters with misleading information. Finding the right balance between parental involvement and teacher training poses a challenge. Consistent, inclusive, and accurate sex education is crucial..

Testing & Evaluation

To verify the project's success, unmoderated task-based usability testing was conducted with 8 participants, and feedback was analysed to refine the prototype iteratively to ensure that the app met specifications, addressing users pain ponits, gaps in sexual education and aligning with user expectations effectively.
